### From the Pastor's Desk

I hope you'll join us this fall as we offer new opportunities for study and spiritual growth. I'm already looking forward to seeing my entire church family again; it's time for our spiritual reunion!

## **Resources for Seniors**

Just recently, I received my Summer 2017 issue of "Reach" magazine which is provided by Dignity Health. This is such a wonderful resource that comes in the mail every few months. It offers a schedule of classes and events for all ages and deals with all kinds of health issues. I have been on the mailing list for this publication for so long that I can't remember how I got on it. If you do not receive this valuable resource in your mailbox – it is provided by St. Rose Dominican Hospital at 102 E. Lake Mead Drive in Henderson, NV 89015.

#### Take Control of Your Diabetes

The topic I wanted to concentrate on today is diabetes. This subject was brought to my attention by members of the congregation who are signed up for upcoming classes on managing this very common disease. According to the 2014 National Diabetes Statistics Report, 29.1 million people (or 9.3% of the population) have diabetes. Approximately a quarter of those people (27.8%) are undiagnosed.

Dignity Health is offering a Diabetes Self-Management Program. This interactive six-week workshop offers support, heathy eating tips, medication management, appropriate exercise to improve strength, flexibility, and endurance, skills to communicate effectively with family, friends, and health professionals, and a step-by-step plan to improve your health and your life. The classes are offered this fall at two locations in Henderson.
