What a joy it was to worship with you on December 11 as my family and I were introduced to Green Valley Presbyterian Church for the first time. Just as that bass singer gave me confidence to sing with everything I had, God wants all of us to help each other use our gifts to advance the Kingdom of God. When we gladly share our spiritual gifts - our God-given talents and resources - we expand that great chorus of praise that belongs to Jesus Christ and we point people to the hope that can only be found in Him. My prayer is that God will enable all of us to find new ways to share our gifts so that we might be a part of expanding God's kingdom in this corner of His world.

Thank you for your warm welcome and the assurance of your prayers during this time of transition as my family and I begin a new chapter in our lives and ministry. My entire family is more grateful than we will ever be able to express in words because we firmly believe that God has called us together.

The Year in Review

Financially the church ended 2016 in very good shape because of a very generous anonymous offering received in November. As a result of this, the income exceeded expenses by \$35,500. There were two unplanned repairs during the year that had significant financial impact. The fire alarm system in the Multi-Purpose Building was close to the end of useful life when one of the circuit boards failed. This required a complete replacement of the system with current technology. Funds were taken from the Reserve Account to

cover the cost of this work. The other unplanned event was interference with the wireless microphone system in the sanctuary as a result of more spectrum being devoted to commercial uses. The cost to resolve this issue was covered in the annual operating budget.

2017 Budget

In the November *Vision*, we reported on the challenge the Session was facing with the 2017 operating budget. Since then the results of the pledge campaign are known. The pledges that have been received give us confidence to significantly raise the income budget. This has eliminated the need for a large transfer of funds from the reserve account to the operating budget and has also made it possible to provide small increases to certain programs. Budget details are included in the 2016 Annual Report.

Tax Deferral Opportunities

In 2017, there are two methods to give to the church that may offer tax advantages for certain people. The first is from the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) of an IRA. If you are required to make a RMD, you can give some or all to the church. The potential advantage of this is that the amount that is transferred to the church does not have to be shown as income on your tax return; however, the gift cannot be claimed as a deduction if you itemize. To gain the tax advantage, your IRA custodian must send a check directly to the church.

The second method is to donate appreciated stock to the church through Charles Schwab, the church's broker. The advantage of this method is that you do not have to claim the gain on the stock as income but you can claim the value of the shares on the day you donate them as an itemized deduction on your taxes.

If you have questions about how either of these techniques might apply to your situations, contact a tax advisor; the church cannot give tax advice. SESSION NOTES – December 2016/January 2017

No Session meeting was held in December, but that didn't keep the members from being very busy with electronic voting and various other Elder duties.

Electronic Vote #1 A motion was made calling a Special Congregational Meeting on December 18, 2016 at 10:00 A.M. to allow the congregation to vote in the remaining Deacons and Elders for the Class of 2019. The motion passed on November 29, 2016.

Electronic Vote #2 A motion was made that year-end bonuses for each paid employee be increased by \$100. An anonymous donation was made specifically to be used to increase the staff bonuses. The motion passed with 1 no response. The motion passed on December 13, 2016.

Electronic Vote #3 A motion was made by the Personnel Committee and sent by the Moderator, Rev. Jim Blades to recommend the Administrative Assistant position to Julie Winkler. The motion passed with 1 no vote. The motion passed on December 15, 2016.

Electronic Vote #4 A motion was made that the 2017 budget approved at the November Session meeting be revised as follows:

- General Operating Fund Increase by \$55,000 to \$625,000
- Transfer from Synod Custodial Fund Decrease by \$39,132 to zero
- HVAC Increase by \$3,000 to \$4,000
- Total Senior Pastor Increase by \$8,000 to a total of \$163,000 Total Other
- Positions Increase by \$1,754 to \$305,170
- Senior Adult Ministries—Increase by \$1,000 to \$2,150
- Monthly Social Increase by \$1,000 to \$1,265
- General Assembly Missions Increase by \$1,115 to \$10,325

This motion was necessary because the final budget will be included in the 2016 Annual Report which must be printed before January 24, 2017 Session meeting. The motion passed on December 28, 2016.

Electronic Vote #5 A motion was made to have one service at 10:00 A.M. on January 15, 2017 for the purpose of holding a farewell reception for our Interim Pastor James Blades. His last day is January 15, 2017. The motion passed with 1 no vote on Dec. 30, 2016.

Electronic Vote #6 A motion was made to replace the carpet in the reception area of Fellowship Hall with the new luxury vinyl plank being installed in the meeting room. The cost shall be \$1,427.71 and paid by the Gingerbread Committee. The vendor shall be Affordable Flooring. The Property Committee has planned to have the meeting hall work completed prior to the Congregational Meeting on January 29 2017, if we are to include the reception area with the meeting room. The motion passed on January 12, 2017.

Resources for Seniors

Information about the YellowDot Program was brought to my attention by a member of the congregation. I am always open to ideas for topics from the congregation so anytime you have information about a resource, especially for seniors, that you feel would be beneficial for others to know about, please feel free to contact me.

YellowDot Program

The YellowDot program is a life-saving program that alerts first responders at a vehicle-incident scene that an occupant may have medical issues.

Through this information, emergency workers can increase the chance of survival or lower the risk of error for a victim who may be incapacitated.

It began when the 2015 Nevada Legislature passed AB 176 requiring the program to be available in counties with populations of more than 700,000. In Clark Country, it is sponsored by AAA and administered by RTC. Nationally, the program was launched in 2002 and is now active in about two dozen states.

A yellow dot decal on the rear window of the driver's side of the vehicle alerts first responders to check the glove compartment, where a YellowDot kit contains vital medical information about the driver and/or passengers.

The kit contains a Yellow Dot decal, and a Yellow Dot envelope containing a paper to be filled out. The information requested is a recent photo of the participants plus names and emergency contact information, list of allergies or medical conditions, contact information of the participants' physician and preferred hospital, and insurance information.

Kits can be obtained from many locations in the county including libraries, recreation centers, and police departments. To request a kit by mail you can call 702-676-1754. For more information, the website is <u>www.rtcsnv.com/yellowdot</u>.




