The year was 1818.

31-year-old church organist, Franz Gruber, had worked hard

to prepare his village choir for a glorious Christmas Eve service. When the day finally came, Franz went early to the church to discover that the organ's moisture-corroded pipes had fallen to a state of wheezes and murmurs. The itinerant organ mender was not due to the city for several more days. Franz Gruber was despondent. He could not possibly expect the choir to sing such elaborate chorales unaccompanied.

Also distressed was the church's young pastor, Joseph Mohr. He had hoped that this, his first Christmas celebration since

being ordained, would be an especially splendid one. But what could they do without the church's organ? Joseph played guitar, but how could his guitar possibly begin to support the complicated fugues and cantatas that had so been long and painstakingly prepared?

Feeling quite in a predicament, the two young men went to work on a solution. Joseph spent the afternoon scribbling out some verses. Franz then fit the words to a simple melody. Just as the two were completing their work, the choir started arriving for the service. It was too late to teach them the whole piece, so Franz and Joseph decided to sing it as a duet accompanied by Joseph's guitar, with the choir echoing the final words of each verse.

That evening, the worshippers arrived to the disappointment of a broken-down organ. But when the service was done, they left with an enchanting new melody imprinted on their hearts. No one, least the two young composers, dreamt that the irritations and disappointments of that day would produce the world's best loved Christmas carol of all time, *Silent Night*.

In this Advent Season, as we turn our thoughts to the celebration of our Savior's birth, let us again be reminded that sometimes our irritations are opportunities in disguise. Sometimes our disappointments are unexpected appointments with God's astonishing grace. Even the most crucial event in all history, our Savior's birth, was bound up in what surely appeared to his parents as the most vexing of circumstances.

Come join us for worship during the weeks of Advent. Come celebrate and reflect upon the real reason for this season. You'll be blessed!

Per Capita Payments in 2017

Once a year congregations pay an annual amount per church member – per capita apportionment – to their respective presbyteries. Per capita funding is how the entire Presbyterian community mutually shares the costs of *Getting Ready in the* New Year by coming together to discern the Spirit's leading for the future and sharing in what makes us Presbyterians. Your once a year payment supports the annual budgets of the Presbytery of Nevada, the Synod of the Pacific, and the General Assembly. Since these higher level councils do not have congregant income, all Presbyterian churches are asked to contribute to their operating costs.

Per Capita is being assessed in the amount of **\$40.00 per member** for 2017, which is an increase over the amount assessed for the past five years. We pray that this increase reflects higher costs and not a reduced level of membership in our Presbyterian Churches.

We ask that you do **not** pay your assessment until after January 1, 2017 and before mid-February. You can pay your assessment by:

- Using the special blue Per Capita envelope contained in your box of offering envelopes, if you have requested them.
- Writing "Per Capita" on the memo line of your check and placing it in the offering plate.
- Using a pew envelope and writing "Per Capita" on the outside of the envelope.
- You may also mail your payment directly to the church office with an appropriate notation with your payment.

Monthly Money Matters - December 2016



Operating Income and Expense

You will notice that the Financial Statement accompanying this article ends on November 12, instead of the end of the previous month as it usually does. Doing so allows us to fully explain the impact of three events that have recently happened.

First, the Session voted to move \$15,500 from the Custodial Fund to the operating fund. This was done to cover the unexpected, unbudgeted cost of replacing the fire alarm system in the Multi-Purpose Building. This transfer decreased the balance in the Custodial Fund and shows up on the Income and Expense statement as Other Income.

Second, Session voted to apply the \$10,000 bequest recently received from Joan Hook's estate towards the CE Building Loan. This has the effect of reducing Other Income by \$10,000 and increasing the Wells Fargo bank balance by the same amount. The \$10,000 will be added to the next payment made on the loan.

Finally, the church has received an anonymous donation of \$50,000 which is truly a Thank Offering to God and a Love Offering to this church. The impact of this will increase the difference between Income and Expenses from \$13,500 in the red at the end of October to almost \$22,000 in the black. We extend our deep appreciation to those who made this generous and timely offering.

2017 Budget

The Session is at work preparing the 2017 Operating Budget and is in a quandary. Our offerings are running almost \$40,000 below budget. The 2016 expense budget was started as a bare bones budget and then was reduced by 3% across the board, except for staff salaries, to bring expenses down to projected income. We were careful to reserve room in the budget for the Senior Pastor's salary and as it turns out, there has been significant under-expenditure in that area. All other budget categories are running near the budget. All this explanation is to say that we see no significant opportunities to reduce the budget in 2017. However, based on the 2016 experience, we feel we must set the income budget close to the projected 2016 amount. Right now, the income budget is set at \$612,000 which we feel is a conservative yet realistic amount. The projected expenditures are \$660,000 which as explained above is what it will take to maintain the programs now in place. The resulting deficit is \$48,000. The big unknown is the response to the current stewardship campaign. We will, of course, make adjustments as the results are known, but based on current knowledge, 2017 could be a very challenging year financially.



Coping with Memory Loss: Tips to help you with Activities of Daily Living

- 1. Post phone numbers in large print by the telephone: include emergency numbers and your address with a description of where you live.
- 2. Keep a book with you at all times that has: Important telephone numbers and addresses including emergency numbers and your own contact information.
 - People's names with their pictures and their relationship to you.
 - Thoughts or ideas you want to hold on to.
 - A map of where your home is.
 - A to-do list of appointments.
- 3. Label cupboards and drawers with words or pictures showing their contents.
- 4. Have a friend call to remind you about meal times, appointments, and medications.
- 5. Set-up automatic bill pay on-line for utilities, telephone, etc.
- 6. Get an easy-to-read digital clock that displays the time and date.7. Use pillboxes to help organize medications.
