From the Pastor's Desk Thirty Days of Giving Thanks

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever.

Psalm 136:1

A friend once told me the most miserable person in the world must certainly be the one who wants to say, "thank you," but does not believe in God. I've thought about this for many years. Can you imagine what it would be like to be emerge from a season of deep need, to know your concerns were relieved and your needs were met, only to find yourself incapable of directing your gratitude to anyone but a few persons in your immediate circle? Each November, I'm reminded that even though Thanksgiving is a national holiday, the profound act of giving thanks is a hallmark of faith. We give thanks because we know that life itself is a gift from God.

The habit of thanks-giving has a way of shining a spotlight on our limitations, frailties, and needs. The Scriptures assure us that blessings don't just fall into our lives by some cosmic game of chance. Every blessing we receive is a gift from God, and to receive those blessings without directing our gratitude to the "giver of every good and perfect gift" would be the ultimate act of ingratitude (James 1:17).

If you're anything like me, in the busyness of life it can be only too easy to forget to say "Thank you, Lord." Oh we might remember to give thanks for the big answers to prayer, but we forget to say, "thank you" for the little blessings that come into our life each and every day.

My sister-in-law has a wonderful habit of celebrating the season of Thanksgiving throughout the month of November. She calls it *30 Days of Giving Thanks*. Each day for 30 days she practices the discipline of saying, "Thank you, Lord, for the blessings you've given." And when I read her posts on Facebook or Instagram, I realize that she is committed to acknowledging the everyday blessings we so often forget to recognize. This year, I'm going to follow in her footsteps because I truly believe that giving thanks is good for the heart, the mind, the soul, and even the body.

When we intentionally say "Thank you, Lord, for everything you've given," we realize that our blessings always outweigh our struggles. And there is something else I've discovered: when we make it a point to express our gratitude, the people around us know that our faith in Jesus Christ really does influence the way we live.

I hope you'll join me in 30 Days of Giving Thanks. And as we begin this journey of gratitude together, I trust you know how profoundly grateful my family is for our call to Green Valley Presbyterian Church. "Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good..."



Monthly Money Matters - October 2017

The Membership and Evangelism Committee is developing a revised GVPC website which will have many new and improved features compared to the existing site. It should be operating by the time you receive this *Vision*. One new feature will be the opportunity for those who wish to make their offerings to the church by credit card to do so directly through the site. Although credit card giving is currently available, it has to be done through the office or the Administration Committee. The revised website will allow you to give directly on-line.

There will be two ways to give on-line. They both start by clicking on the *Donate Now* link found on the new home page. After you click on the *Donate Now* link you will see a new page titled **DONATE NOW**, you will have three choices:

The first is CREATE AN ACCOUNT

The second is SIGN IN and

The third is GUEST GIVING

<u>CREATE AN ACCOUNT:</u> If you want to give frequently, set up a periodically recurring gift and have your gifts recorded in the church accounting system, you must first create an account. Click on this link and you will be led through the steps to create an account including creating a password. If you are already in the church accounting system you will be linked to that record and all your giving will be recorded just as it is now. If you are not presently in the data base, a record will be created for you.

SIGN IN: Once you have created an account, click the Sign In link to access your account. If you want to give a certain amount every week or month, you will be able to do so. Once done your offering will be automatically charged to your credit card and credited to your church account. If you want to make a one-time gift, you can do that as well. You will always be able to give to the General Operating Fund, the Building Fund, and to the Deacons; occasionally you will be able to give to other special offerings.

<u>GUEST GIVING:</u> If you only want to make a one-time gift and do not want the gift recorded, you can use the *Guest Giving* link to do so. You will be able to give to the same funds as above.

Some of you have pledged and are currently giving to the General Operating or Building Funds by credit card. You do not need to do anything to continue those gifts, they will continue until the end of your pledge which is December 2017 for the General Operating Fund and April 2018 for the Building Fund

Online giving will give you more flexibility to manage your offerings to the church; the data will be automatically uploaded to the ACS accounting system and will relieve our staff of the manual entry of that data. We hope you will take advantage of it. You can, however, continue to give your card information to the church; someone from the staff or the Administration Committee will enter it to the database.

Senior Adult Ministries | November 2017

Last month, I took the opportunity to hear Frank Abagnale speak. Abagnale is the con artist whose life is the basis for the movie "Catch Me if you Can". He told the story of how he began and became so successful at conning people when he was 16-21 years old. For the last 40+ years he has worked for the FBI as an identity theft expert.

The program I attended was sponsored by AARP's Fraud Watch Network who is partnering with Abagnale to help us protect ourselves.

The Las Vegas Metropolitan area is ranked #25 among the largest metro areas for identity theft consumer complaints nationally with 145.4 complaints per 100,000 residents. 33% of statewide identity theft fraud is credit card fraud.

Frank's Top 10 Tips to help prevent identity theft are:

- 1. Protect yourself by checking your credit regularly.
- 2. Provide your social security number only when absolutely necessary.
- 3. Shred all mail and documents with your personal info using a micro-cut shredder.
- 4. Check each transaction on your credit card statements.
- 5. Retrieve your mail ASAP or invest in a locking mailbox to avoid mail theft and thieves re-routing your mail.
- 6. Be selective with whom you share your personal information.
- 7. Be on the lookout for skimmers or bugged keypads at ATMs.
- 8. Keep passwords strong and change them on a regular basis.
- 9. Use credit cards as the preferred form of payment over debit cards and the fewer credit cards, the better.
- 10. Keep your firewall, antivirus, and spyware protection up-to-date.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

From the meeting of September 26, 2017

Pastor's Report - Rev. Adrian Doll

Mission Trip with CARE for AIDS to Kenya – September 6-16, 2017. Over \$3,000 received for CARE for AIDS. Received a letter from missionaries in Costa Rica, Ted and Grace Quiocho, inviting a Short-Term Missions Team to serve with them in 2018. An exploratory/vision trip with pastor and one other person is recommended to understand the logistics needed before sending a team. The Quiocho's feel this exploratory/vision trip should take place before the end of 2017.

Fellowship Committee will be co-hosting with the Christian Education Committee the Advent Potluck on Sunday, December 3, 2017. This will take place following the 11:00AM service. The main course will be provided by the Fellowship Committee.

<u>Membership Committee</u> is expecting to launch the GVPC church website by the middle of October. The church directory pictures are being scheduled. New invitation cards and brochures are being produced to reflect the new church schedules.

<u>Worship and Music Committee</u> will be busy the month of October with World Communion Sunday, October 1; Appreciation Sunday, October 8; and Reformation Sunday, October 29.

A motion was made requesting session to approve the Sammy Fundraiser for November 12 or 19, 2017. The motion carried.

A motion was made requesting Session to approve ticket sales for the Messiah Concert on December 6, 2017. The motion carried. (Mountain View Church will not be providing the Messiah Concert at their church this year. The last time one concert was offered, people were turned away. To avoid this, the committee wants to try ticket sales with a possible after-concert refreshment. Printing three hundred tickets at \$15.00 per ticket was discussed).

A motion was made requesting session to approve the raffle of gift baskets this year. The motion carried.

<u>Christian Education Committee</u> reported that the Advent Potluck will include a family advent craft project, singing led by Kaymen Carter and a family advent calendar given to each family in attendance. Vacation Bible School will be held from June 4-8, 2018.

The following three motions were approved by session:

Request approval for the youth to attend the Winter Jam Concert at The Orleans on November 11, 2017 (Winter Jam is a Christian music concert featuring many amazing bands).

Request approval for a joint lock-in with Grace Presbyterian Church from October 13-14, 2017 (the youth would be staying at Grace Presbyterian Church as a way to get our youth together and build community).

Request having a middle and high school youth offering during the four weeks of Advent be spent on purchasing items for our annual "Homeless Youth" Christmas tree (spending the offering from Advent time period correlates directly with the four week video series the youth will be experiencing during Advent).

<u>Missions Committee</u> members are growing in size due to Rally Sunday sign-ups. The last day to submit donations for the Coat Drive is Sunday, October 15, 2017 with delivery to schools during the week of October 29, 2017.

<u>Administration Committee</u> approved the following: Funds in the Chase money market account be transferred to the checking account and that the money market account be closed.

The FFAPC requested use of the parking lot for a sale on September 23, 2017. Authority has been delegated to the committee to approve two fund raisers by the FFAPC each year. This was the first approval in 2017.

The synod has asked for an update of the individuals authorized to withdraw funds from the Synod Custodial Account. The following individuals are Allen Randle, Connie Mulick and John Yates.

A motion was made requesting session to approve raising the limit on Youth Director Renee Kelly's credit card from \$3500 to \$4000. The motion carried.

<u>Clerk's Report</u> - A motion was made to ratify the following electronic vote which carried:

To authorize a request that the congregation be given the opportunity to make contributions to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for the Houston flood.
