#### From the Pastor's Desk

"Share a memory of a person who had a major impact on your youth." This was the instruction given at a recent gathering of pastors. One by one, we went around the table and described someone who influenced our life in a positive way. What struck me is how many of us summarized our comments with the following expression of gratitude: "Without his/her influence, I would not be the person I am today." As I described my friend, Harlee, an older gentleman who made a big impression on my young life, I could not help but wonder where God might be inviting GVPC to make lasting investments in our young people.

When I think about Harlee, I remember how he expressed his genuine interest in my life. When I was in junior high, he would stop me in the halls of our church to ask me about my after-school activities. During high school, Harlee would inquire about my future aspirations. And when I came home from college, he and his wife always made a point of inviting me to dinner. Harlee made a lasting influence in my life because he chose to love and encourage me even with all my insecurities and immaturity.

So often I hear conversations focused on a repeating theme: "We need more young people in this church." I could not agree more. But I wonder how many of us purposely stop to talk to our students on Sunday mornings or take the time to learn about their lives. One of the most beautiful sights I can remember seeing in a church was an older woman kneeling down so she could talk to a child and look him in the eye as a sign of respect and love. Children and youth long to be acknowledged, valued, and loved.

As I begin to own up to the fact that I have reached mid-life, I sometimes question what role I might have in a young person's life. At times I feel completely out of touch with popular culture and the temptation is to assume I'm the wrong person or someone else will make a better connection. But then I think about numerous studies on Christian community and Millennials (persons who came of age in the early 21<sup>st</sup> century). Millennials and young people disdain insincerity; they value substance over show and authentic relationships over the superficial. And that is something all of us can offer, sincere hearts and voices that express interest and love for a young person. So maybe it's time for all of us to find ways to look a child or teenager in the eye and say," It's so good to see you today because I think you are very important and I want to get to know you." We may never know the results, but we will know we are following the example of a godly saint who made a lasting mark on our life.

The U.S. VETS has been a long standing GVPC local mission program started by Tony Cannella and over the last year led by Carol Riback. GVPC volunteers meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday each month to serve the evening meal and visit with the Vets at the U.S. Vets facility in downtown Las Vegas. Additionally, the GVPC congregation donates gently used household and clothing items deposited in the large box in the Fellowship Hall that is collected and taken to the facility bi-monthly.

The U.S. Vets mission has used the church van for volunteers to drive together to the facility on the Saturdays when GVPC serves and also for delivering the clothing items. With the decision by Session to sell the church van due to necessary safety related concerns and expensive repairs, those currently leading the U.S. Vets feel unable to continue the mission.

As members of the Missions Committee, we are reaching out to members of the congregation to see if there is anyone who would be interested in heading up some aspect of this mission that has touched the lives of so many veterans living in our area. Change also opens the possibilities of redirecting the mission. The U.S. VETS organization has greatly appreciated receiving the clothing donated by GVPC, noting it is the nicest clothing received. **Perhaps the mission could only focus in providing clothing. Is there someone with a truck or van who would be willing with the help of volunteers to collect the clothing at GVPC and take it to the U.S. VETS facility bi-monthly?** 

We wish to thank the volunteers for their service in the U.S. VETS mission. We hope there remains the possibility of continuing some aspect of the mission; otherwise, regrettably, it will end. #### CE Loan Progress Report April 2018

As reported earlier, the current 3 year building fund pledges conclude at the end of April. Thanks to everyone who has given so faithfully to this effort. As further explained before, we are asking people to continue to give to the building fund with the objective of paying off the loan by the end of 2018. Those of you who have been giving by credit card and wish to continue to do so will need to start giving through VANCO, our new credit card agent. You can do this on the GVPC website, <u>www.greenvalleypres.com</u>, by clicking on the Giving link found just below the scrolling pictures on the top of the page. The link will open a new page that will allow you to create an account or access an existing account to set up periodic gifts to the building fund. As an alternative, you can give your credit card information and the amount you wish to give to the office and we can set up account for you. The balance on the loan was \$115,276 at the end of March. The April payment has reduced that to \$110,970. Another \$8,568 has accumulated in the checking account after the first three weeks in April; that amount will continue to increase this month. The total accumulated in April will be paid against the loan early in May. We are on schedule to payoff the loan by the end of the year. Thanks to the faithful givers in the congregation.

#### **Monthly Money Matters**

As you will see from the chart below, at the end of March our financial results were significantly less than anticipated in the budget (an actual \$16,915 loss compared to a budgeted \$5,065 gain.) There are a couple of items, namely purchase of the new folding chairs and loss of rent from the Filipino congregation, that will have a lasting impact compared to the budget. Most of the rest of the difference between actual income and budget is the result of timing. Income that was expected in January or February has not yet been received. Likewise, some expenditures have been made earlier in the year that the budget anticipated. Once these timing issue are resolved, the financial statement will look much better.

# **Senior Resource Article**

#### (SHIP) State Health Insurance Assistance Program

As often happens, I received a suggestion from a member of the congregation to let people know about SHIP. SHIP stands for State Health Insurance Assistance Program. It is a FREE health benefits counseling service for those on Medicare plus their families or caregivers. Its mission is to educate advocate, counsel and empower people to make informed healthcare benefit decisions. If you are qualified for Medicare, you are qualified for SHIP counseling. SHIP was originally established to address confusion caused by the increase in choices of Medicare Supplemental Insurance or Medigap. Since SHIP in Nevada was established in 1993, its services have greatly expanded. SHIP volunteers offer one-on-one assistance and counseling with respect to many problems encountered by seniors. They can provide unbiased information to assist the consumer. Counselors in Nevada are responding to over 1,000 phone calls every month. Below is contact information for assistance from SHIP:
