Never in a million years did I imagine that I would be writing this summer newsletter with the announcement that we have successfully paid off the loan on our Christian Education building. To put it mildly, I am overwhelmed with gratitude to God and the many people who gave faithfully to bring us to this point of celebration. An unexpected and generous gift by an anonymous donor enabled us to reach this monumental moment in the history of Green Valley Presbyterian Church. And as Allen Randle, Co-Chair of the Administration Committee so clearly expressed on Sunday, May 13, "Every dollar was as important from the first to the last." Each gift to the building fund helped us to build the foundation upon which our church now stands. We are free from the burden of debt. Certainly this is cause for celebration, joy, and thanksgiving to God, "the giver of every good and perfect gift" (James 1:17).

As I think about the significance of this moment, I can't help but recall the excitement and rush of adrenaline I felt standing atop a mountainous promontory at the Cape of Good Hope in South Africa, the most South-Western Point on the African Continent. I was in absolute awe of the rocky and majestic landscape fashioned by the turbulent waters of the Atlantic and Indian Oceans. As I looked down below, I was filled with gratitude at the signs of God's creative power and majesty. Today, our congregation stands on a historical mountaintop surrounded by the evidence of God's goodness and grace. Our church has a rich history; we are known throughout the Las Vegas Valley for our commitment to excellence in our worship and music ministries; and we are recognized for our involvement with local mission projects such as the Henderson Food Bank and Friends in the Desert. We have every reason to give thanks for the numerous ways God has and God is working through us to share his love and grace. And we can look to the future with the excitement of a mountain climber who knows there are as yet undiscovered joys in the vast landscape below.

As we celebrate our past and present, we are invited to look far into the future to prayerfully discern where God might be leading us to creatively expand the ministries and outreach of our church. In the months ahead, I will be asking Session to consider several staffing and ministry models as we work to effectively meet the needs of our congregation and position our church for further growth guided by the principles of our mission statement "to glorify God, grow in Christ, and generously share God's love and grace." This is an exciting time in the life of our church and we have every reason to echo the words of that great Gospel hymn, "To God be the glory great things he hath done!"

Christmas in July

The Board of Deacons is planning Christmas in July, the annual food drive that benefits the local food pantries supported by the GVPC Board of Deacons. Thanks to the generosity of our wonderful congregation, the Deacons typically transport 5-6 completely packed vehicles of much needed nonperishable food, diapers, toilet paper and other needed items to the Henderson Presbyterian Food Bank and to Friends in the Desert at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church in downtown Henderson.

Beginning the end of June, a Christmas Cactus, decorated with ornaments, will appear in the Narthex. Various food items will be listed on the ornaments, the listed items are specifically needed by the Food Banks. We ask that you take as many ornaments as you would like over the month of July, purchase the items and return along with the laminated ornaments to the Narthex between July 1st and 31st. The Deacons will then organize and deliver the donated food to the Food Banks.

Some of the items needed are as follows: cereal, canned meat (chicken, Spam, tuna foil packs, vienna sausage), canned chili, ravioli (pull open cans appreciated), cereal (any size), Campbell's pasta soups, snacks (individually wrapped soft cookies, bars, granola bars), individual packets peanut butter or cheese crackers, individual bags of chips, juice boxes, jello or pudding cups/cans, dry pet food (any size), individual fruit cups/applesauce. Also, toilet paper, crew socks, t-shirts.

Monetary donations are welcome and will be used to purchase meat, bread, fresh produce, paper goods and cleaning supplies. Please make checks payable to Green Valley Presbyterian Church and note Christmas in July on the check.

May 2018 GOOD NEWS!! CE Loan Progress Report

Thank you to each of you who responded and contributed to the Building Fund during the early part of 2018. This generosity helped reduce the balance of the loan considerably by April of 2018. After an update to the congregation on May 6, additional donations to the building fund payoff were received. In addition, during the week of May 7 an anonymous donation was received that allowed us to pay the remaining balance of the loan on the CE Building and have additional funds left over for other needed building related projects. A check in the amount of \$111,617.69 was mailed to the Synod on May 17 that brings that loan to an end. We are debt free for the first time since moving to this site!!!

Those of you who were planning to continue giving to the Building Fund this year may be wondering what to do now. Of course, the Stewardship Committee would be grateful if you continued with those offerings to the church. There are several ways you could direct your giving. There are several building related projects such as painting the Sanctuary, re-finishing the front doors to the Sanctuary, reducing the noise level in the Fellowship Hall, etc. that are pending. Any offerings you designate for the building fund will be used for these or similar projects. The other approach is to give to the general operating fund; to fund other items, such as the Costa Rica mission trip, from the general fund.

God has been good to this church in both economically good times and bad. There have been three economic slowdowns in this century; one after 9/11; one in 2000, and another in 2007. Many churches struggled during these times. At GVPC we have, on occasion, worried about our finances and watched our pennies more closely than usual but we have never missed a payroll, a loan payment or any other obligation. Thanks to God and thanks to all the faithful people of this congregation. Thanks to all! Good news indeed!

Monthly Money Matters

If you will recall, last month it was reported that YTD income was significantly less than budget while YTD expenses were over budget. A couple of expenditures accounted for some of the expenses but most of the difference between both income and expenses and their budgets was timing. April offerings significantly exceeded the budget while expenses continued to come closer to the budget. As a result, last month's negative picture has turned very positive.

Thanks again goes to all the faithful people of this congregation.

In past columns, I have featured programs such as the Stanford Diabetes Self-Management Program and Powerful Tools for Caregivers that are offered by Dignity Health and promoted in their "Reach" magazine.

In this issue, I want to bring to your attention the wide variety of free or low-cost wellness, nutrition, health and fitness classes that are offered at three convenient locations. Classes include such things as yoga, tai chi, stop smoking, meditation, AARP Smart Driver, and eating for a healthy heart to name just a few. Many support groups are also offered and appointments can be made for a variety of screenings. Over 4000 classes each year reach 80,000 residents.

A member of our church not only highly recommended the classes but even took me to visit the Green Valley location so I could see it for myself. The building is located at the corner of Paseo Verde and Pecos and is shared with a credit union.

FRIENDS IN THE DESERT

On May 12 we served our Friends in the Desert one of their favorite luncheons of sloppy joe sandwiches, tater tots, coleslaw, ice cream bars, potato chips and lemonade. We served 93 hot meals, as well as 37 take outs. Our "Lunch Brigade" delivered 100 sack lunches for our FITD's Sunday lunch, the only day a hot meal is not served.

After our Friends In The Desert enjoyed their meal, the men and women were provided the opportunity to pick up new underwear, socks, pet food and gently used clothing items. All these items were supplied by members of our congregation who either purchased the clothing and delivered them to the church office or donated money to be used for clothing purchases. Obtaining a pair of new socks and a new set of underclothes may seem a normal part of life for many of us, but for those who are homeless or who are trying to survive from month to month on limited funds, it is considered a luxury. The recipients of the new clothing express their gratitude to our congregation for their generosity. If you would like to donate socks or underclothes for this very important outreach mission, we are in need of new white T-shirts in sizes large and x-large and new crew socks. During the hot summer months, baseball hats, sun screen and sun glasses would also be appreciated.
