

### **Monthly Money Matters**

October 2018

The latest Financial Statement below shows that the church remains in good shape financially, thanks to the faithful offerings of our congregation. Both offerings and the utility payments from our the cell providers are essentially on budget. Other income is significantly below budget primarily due to the loss of the monthly rent from the Filipino Presbyterian Church. Expenses are about ½ percent over budget; part of that is just timing which will work itself out. Another reason is the purchase of the new chairs in the Multi-Purpose Building.

Now that the CE Building loan has been paid off, we have been able to complete building improvement projects such as refinishing the doors to the Sanctuary and the sound control installation in the Fellowship Hall. Thanks to those of you who have continued to present offerings to the Building Fund.

Since the end of the year is rapidly approaching this is a good time to discuss a couple of ways for you to give to the church that can also offer tax advantages to you. The first is a direct contribution from your IRA to the church. This only works if you are required to take a Required Minimum Deduction (RMD). The law allows you to make a direct payment from your IRA to the church If you do so, the amount contributed counts towards your RMD but does not count as income on your tax return. However, you cannot claim the amount contributed as a charitable contribution. Your IRA custodian can help with such a transaction.

The second method is to donate appreciated stock to the church. If you do so, you can claim the full market value of the donated stock as a charitable deduction and you do not have to pay capital gains tax on the appreciation of the stock. The church maintains an account at Charles Schwab to facilitate these transactions. If either of these approaches interests you contact Allen Randle or Carol Johnson for more information.

The Henderson Parks & Recreation Department has won awards for its outstanding recreation centers scattered throughout the city. One of those centers, the **Heritage Park Senior Facility** is unique because it is for the 50+ population.

In this article, I'm discussing only a little of what is available at **Heritage Park Senior Facility**. I'm not even touching on all the classes and activities that are offered every day.

- **Meals** are served Monday-Friday from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. The suggested donation is \$2.50 for those 60+ and \$5.00 for people under the age of 60.
- **Meals on Wheels** is headquartered in this building. These meals are delivered on Monday through Friday and the suggested donation is \$2.50 per meal. They even offer Meals on Wheels for pets.
- The **Senior Resource Center** is housed in this building and is available from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm on Monday through Friday.
- **Meadows Café** offers beverages, sandwiches, salads and other assorted snacks at very reasonable prices. They now offer a catering service.
- Library one of branches of Henderson Libraries is located in this building. It is open from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm on Monday through Friday and 9:00 am to 3:00 pm on Saturdays. A dozen computers are available for library card holders. Books, large-print books, audiobooks and DVDs can be checked out. Library staff is onsite on Thursdays from 8:00 am to noon. Otherwise it is staffed by volunteers.
- The **Fitness center** offers a variety of machines and other fitness equipment. It is open the same hours as the center.
- The **Mini Mart Grocery Store** is managed by the Senior Auxiliary and offers substantial discounts on grocery items. It is open from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm on Fridays.

For further information, please google Heritage Park Senior Facility. Information on all the many classes and activities that are offered can be found in the "Henderson Happenings" magazine that is mailed out 3 times a year. I have volunteered at Heritage Park Senior Facility since 2011, coordinated the volunteers in the library for the past 3 years and served on the Senior Auxiliary board the past 18 months. I can tell you first hand that it is a great place and I hope you will check it out if you have not yet been there.
