We live in a culture that urges us to measure the degree of our happiness and satisfaction by our accumulations, wealth, the accolades we receive, and our outward circumstances. Consequently, we spend a lifetime trying to grasp on to that ephemeral sense of satisfaction and happiness. Ironically, however, recent surveys suggest that Americans are increasingly less content, fulfilled, or happy.

In his "Sermon on the Mount," Jesus turns our understanding of happiness and success upside down as he challenges the paradigms and values of this world. Jesus urges us to look beyond our outward circumstances and to focus on the hope that God alone can offer if we want to discover what lasting happiness looks like. Join us as we explore Jesus' prescription and description for the blessed life as found in "The Beatitudes."

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The following motions were made, seconded and carried from the Stated Meeting of Session on January 28, 2020.

Spring Presbytery – GVPC Elders Cynthia Dakus, Connie Mulick, Bernadette O’Neill, and Diane Schurr were approved as Commissioners to the Nevada Presbytery 2020.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the resignation of Elder Ron Sharetts, Class of 2020, with regret. Thank you, Ron, for your years of service to GVPC.

A motion was made, seconded and carried for Elder Susan Walker to be our Elder Liaison to the Deacons and to meet at least once quarterly with them at their monthly meeting.

A motion was made, seconded and carried for the continuation of ongoing practices to be updated every year:

- a. The Pastor is authorized by Session to perform baptisms after appropriate counseling and at his own discretion and report them to the Session at their next stated meeting. (Book of Order G-3.0201b.)
- b. Individual Deacons and Elders are authorized to serve communion to shut-ins with the Pastor. (Book of Order G-3.0201b.)
- c. Communion is served by the Pastor and ordained officers who are members of GVPC. It is understood by Session that communion servers will not be limited to current members of Session or Board of Deacons. (Book of Order G-3.0201b.)
- d. Communion is served normally at each Saturday worship service, at worship services on the first Sunday of each month, Holy Week and at such other times as Session may designate. (Book of Order G-3.0201b.)
- e. The Clerk of Session and any GVPC staff member in attendance at a Session meeting are granted voice.


Dana's Place is highlighting the story book:

The Page Turners meeting on Thursday, March 5 at 2:00 pm will be a group discussion of the book *"In the Midnight Room"* by a local Las Vegas author, Laura McBride. The group has also read her book, *"We are called to Rise."*

In this work, June Stein abandons the safe world of her New Jersey childhood for life in 1950s Las Vegas. For the next 60 years, June will upend conventions, risk her heart and her life, rear a child, lose a child, love more than one man, and stand up for more than one woman.

Her story intertwines with those of three unlikely strangers: a one-time mail order bride from the Philippines, a high school music teacher, and a young mother from Mexico working as a hotel maid.

McBride's novel explores the unexpected ways that life connects us, changes us, and even perfects us. *"In the Midnight Room"* is a smart, insightful novel about womanhood, family bonds, and how we live in America now.

Ms. McBride will be the featured speaker at a local author showcase being held at the Paseo Verde Library on Saturday, March 28.

These articles show me what people find important and what they feel may be good information to pass on to others. The article I selected to review for this edition of the "Vision" came from the Dec. 2019/Jan. 2020 issue of Reader's Digest. It is titled, "How to Help a Friend Grieve." The author is Megan Devine who wrote the book "It's OK That You're Not OK". Megan Devine, even though she is a psychotherapist, found she was quite ignorant on the topic of grief when she lost her partner. Here are some main points that I got from the article.


How to Help a Friend Grieve

- *"Some people are so afraid to say or do the wrong thing that they choose to do nothing at all. That's certainly an option, but it's not often a good one."*
- *"We see grief as something to overcome, something to fix, rather than something to tend or support."*
- *"The best thing you can do for a grieving friend is anticipate their needs."* Identify a need; think how you can help, make an offer and then show up to do it.
- By assisting in small, ordinary ways, you can lessen the burdens of their everyday life.
- Say something. Do something. Be there. Listen. *"Above all, show your love."*

I also googled Megan Devine and found an informative 4-minute YouTube video titled "How do you help a grieving friend?" It was posted on July 18, 2018. Here are some takeaways from the video clip.

- Trying to cheer up grieving people doesn't really work. The pain that comes with grief can't be healed by trying to take it away.
- It is more effective to join your friend in their pain. Acknowledging what they are going through tends to make things better even when they can't be made right.
